BISHOPS BURBLINGS

There may be some who will be saying, "why are you bothering to write an article for a magazine that no one is going to read?"

You may well now be looking at that statement rather quizzically, so I'll explain.



As you might have seen, an astronomical phenomenon is being banded around on social media with the breathless announcement of a planetary alignment on January 25th 2025. Claims are being made in certain quarters that all eight planets will be in a line on one side of the sun and will be visible to the naked eye in our night-time sky.

This planetary alignment has raised the interest of some who are using it as an excuse to proclaim that all is not well with the universe and that the alignment is in fact the precursor to the end of the world.

This doom mongering is of course nothing new. Hal Lindsay, an American evangelist who died in December, wrote a number of hugely successful books in the 1980's and 90's in which, using the text from the New Testament Book of Revelation, he attempted to show that a number of the apocalyptic forecasts in Revelation had already come to pass, others were occurring, and that the end of the world would soon be upon us. He ended up re-writing and editing these books a number of times, as his predictions failed to materialise. For centuries of course, there have been those who have faithfully read and followed the writings of Nostradamus. Once again, whilst it may be possible, at a stretch, to accept that some of what Nostradamus predicted has come to be, the vast majority has not.

For those of you reading this and now looking out at the night sky wondering if the end is indeed nigh - be assured, this planetary alignment is another partial-myth. Yes, there will be planets in our evening sky throughout January, and yes, they are in what appears to be a line - albeit actually an optical illusion - but then, this alignment is like it always is. And there will only be 6 and not 8 planets visible. So, the great planetary alignment does have a grain of truth to it even if it has been made out to be something more than it actually is.

In our age of social media and the seeming acceptance by some of whatever they read "on-line", it is not always easy to know what is true and what is a myth. Either deliberately peddled for mischief or just simply misinformation.

The church is sadly not immune to this either. It is not always easy to discern whether what we hear from our church leaders is truth or what someone chooses to say is true in order to fit with a particular agenda or motive.

At the end of the day - literally as well as metaphorically - the only truth we can always rely on, is the promise of love, hope and salvation given by Jesus, the Word made flesh, whose birth we have recently celebrated.

As we look ahead at the year to come, it will be with a certain amount of trepidation as we look to events in the Middle East and the Ukraine; a change of President in the USA; concerns about the economy here in the UK and rising levels of street crime and violence.

But we also look forward to times of celebration, especially here in our own community, as we come together on 23rd February at St Bartholomew, Burstow, to celebrate the 350th anniversary of the appointment of John Flamsteed as the first ever Astronomer Royal by Charles II. Flamsteed, in addition to this royal duty, was the Rector of St Bartholomew Church from 1684 until his death in 1719.

So, come along and join us at 10.00am at St Bartholomew's for this celebration, we would love to meet with you and welcome you.



In addition, we will be marking the 10th anniversary of the creation of the Windmill United Benefice of St Bartholomew, Burstow; St Mary the Virgin, Horne, and St John the Baptist, Outwood. More details will come in due course on how that will be marked throughout the Benefice.

Whatever our outlook on the months and year to come, we can be assured that God is with us through the presence of Jesus who holds us in his arms of love, and the Spirit who guides and leads us.

STARS AND SPIRES PROJECT AT ST BARTHOLOMEW'S BURSTOW

We are excited to share the latest developments in the Stars and Spires project, a community initiative celebrating the life of John Flamsteed, his connection with St Bartholomew and the intersection of history, science, religion and creativity.

The "Stars" section of the programme is shaping up to be an engaging educational journey. Schools will explore Flamsteed's legacy as the first Royal Astronomer and former rector of St. Bartholomew Church. Tailored activities scheduled for Spring term, will align with the Key Stage 1 curriculum and foster learning behaviours, including perseverance and collective knowledge-building. Schools will have their pupils' creative work featured in an exhibition at St. Bartholomew's Church, in summer 2025. The programme will culminate in a Flamsteed Festival in early July, blending learning, creativity, and celebration.

To kick-start our public programme, we are working with partners to host a range of events over **February Half term (15-23 February 2025)** for all the family: including stargazing evenings,

"How to Be an Astronomer", a mobile planetarium, astronomy inspired craft activities and storytelling and talks by Tony Roberts [Chairman of the Croydon Astronomical Society] and Dr Susan Payne UCL researcher and author of 'Astronomy on Tap'.

NATURE WATCH

happy and healthy new year to all and much enjoyment of the nature around us even though some things are changing at an ever, faster pace. A key indicator comes from the plant world and this year I think the signs have been very clear with hazel trees starting to produce their dusty yellow catkins in mid-December and snowdrops just showing colour late in the month. Meanwhile in the garden hellebores aka "Christmas roses" lived up to their name by breaking into flower in more sheltered spots – the white ones always seem to be first to show. Another sign has been the busy activity of the grey squirrel population and the sheer numbers of them. They don't hibernate they simply tuck themselves away and wrap themselves in their tails if the weather is really cold, however, during the mild weather we experienced up to early January, they continued gathering food supplies almost non-stop since the autumn with most gardeners experiencing bulbs such as tulips and, fritillaries being dug up from pots – its worth remembering you can discourage them by using cayenne pepper or ground chilli powder or simply cover with chicken wire. I'm convinced the population has been larger than ever this year and have never before have I seen so many dead squirrels on the local lanes. Things have gone much quieter since the cold snap in mid-January.

Another wild flower that always puts in an early display has been the winter heliotrope (*Petasites fragrans*) also known as bog rhubarb. It was first introduced to the UK from Italy in 1803. It is an unusual plant because it is exclusively monoecious male, meaning that it does not produce seed and can only reproduce via the very invasive rhizomes. It grows best near to waterways, like the ditch bankside near the entrance to Brightleigh Farm. The flowers, which as the name implies have a marked perfume with hints of vanilla and is even said to smell like cherry pie, are pink touched with purple and are clustered on 20cm stems which appear in mid-December with leaves following in January, although the mild conditions this year resulted in both appearing almost at the same time.

Walking in the countryside can give rise to some unexpected finds. A particularly unusual one came as the result of a phone call from Ashley Williams, the National Trust ranger, prior to her departure to South Africa. She explained that contractors had been carrying out work on some local footpaths and found that on one, between High Stile and the National Trust yard where rainwater had caused erosion, some sections of a broken gravestone were poking through and on investigation found that one bore the name of Steer, which with further work showed he was Arthur Steer. It seems certain that it came from the old Baptist Chapel on the common, which was deconsecrated following the last service held on 30 September 1979 and the subsequent sale in

1980. Gravestones were removed from the graveyard and moved to the southerly edge of the common adjoining the chapel grounds. As one would expect some gravestones must have been broken during the removal and used as rubble on nearby paths. Arthur Steer was first recorded in the 1891 census, aged 27 living at The Castle in the village with his mother Millie, who was housekeeper to Richard Morley the publican, after whose death he took over the licence and became the landlord between 1900 – 1910.





HORLEY REPAIR CAFÉ @ ST WILFS OPENS FOR THE FIRST TIME

A new Repair Café has started in Horley. The Repair Café organisation is international with over 2,500 Repair Cafes worldwide. There are many in Britain and now Horley has its own. Vast numbers of items are thrown away where often a simple repair would give these items a new lease of life. By repairing these items they are saved from landfill, raw materials are saved, and the owner saves money. It also means these repairing skills are passed to others rather than being lost forever.

We also acts a community hub, allowing people to meet and chat over a hot drink and piece of cake whilst their items are being repaired. Owners of items can get as involved as they want to with the repair, even undertaking it themselves if they so wish, overseen by one of the volunteers.

The first session of the Horley Repair Café which is a Church run event was a resounding success with over 40 items brought in, of which over half were successfully repaired. Items included a sewing machine, vacuum cleaner, a bike with a puncture, a record player, lamps, a soft toy in need of stitching and implements that required sharpening.

We currently have a great team of volunteers covering repairs to electrical, electronic, woodwork, mechanical and general items, clothing, hi/fi & audio, bicycles, tool/knife sharpening, and computers.

The repair service is offered free of charge (parts chargeable) and donations are welcome to cover running costs.

As some of you will know, my family and I are feeling very blessed as we're expecting a baby boy very shortly.

The bar was set incredibly high this year and I want to thank all the pupils for making it a wonderfully festive competition.





We all know Christmas is a busy time, with many sending gifts and cards to friends and family far and wide. When deliveries fail to arrive, questions must be asked. I met with staff at Royal Mail's Caterham Delivery Office again last month, where I was assured that new hires would help resolve this issue. If you do not see deliveries improve, please let me know as my team will be following up with the office in February.

In December, in the national picture, I voted against the Government's Family Farms Tax which will drive up food prices for everyone. I have also co-sponsored the Safer Phones Bill. This piece of legislation is designed to make it harder for companies to push addictive content on children, one of the main causes of smartphone addiction. As Children's Minister, I heard time and time again how parents' number one worry was how to handle their children's access to digital devices. While I would like to go further and see a ban on social media for under 16s, this Bill is a crucial step in the right direction.

In my Shadow Ministerial briefs, I wrote for the Telegraph on why the new Government's failure to back new nuclear power stations will be their biggest mistake and push up energy bills for everyone – you can find the article on my website. In my new equalities role, I pressured the Government into releasing data on organisations who weren't following the law on protecting single-sex spaces for women and girls, and pushed the Government to ban first-cousin marriage and make it crystal clear to all public bodies that they should not be implementing race-based hiring policies.

And finally, as we said goodbye to 2024, it was wonderful to see so many incredible East Surrey residents recognised in His Majesty The King's New Year Honours – from Dr Thomas Balchin, Vivien Jones and Zoë Harris from Lingfield, to Ben Commins and Robin Clements from Caterham, and Her Honour Sehba Haroon Storey from Whyteleafe.
