JULIAN ALDERTON



Julian, a retired electrical engineer and respected village character since 1963, passed away on 30th January at the age of 94 after a short illness. He will be remembered for his contribution to the Outwood Society, Church and British Legion.

He led an adventurous life before settling down in the village having served as an RAF dive bomber pilot in the Malayan campaign before moving his family to Ghana and later travelling the African and Asian sub-continent on business.

A keen car enthusiast, he drove a Sunbeam Rapier in the challenging 1965 Monte Carlo Rally and maintained a 1948 Y-type MG saloon which chauffeured many a local bridesmaid to church.

Julian was a stalwart regular at "The Feathers" which had a raucous crew in the 1960's and throughout the years he played his part in village theatrics and social events. A prominent letter writer he was never shy to voice his opinions, and he was a lively reporter of village news for The Surrey Mirror and other publications. He was for many decades an influential member of the Outwood and Horne branch of the Royal British Legion culminating in holding the office of lifetime President.

Julian is survived by his loving wife of 72 years, Thelma, and his two sons, Nicholas and Timothy. He will be sadly missed by his family and many friends in Outwood, past and present.

May he Rest in Peace.

A WARDEN'S WARBLING

A short while ago I had coffee at our local Haskins Garden Centre. Afterwards, I was looking around at all the purchases newly on show where the extensive stock of Christmas themed things had been. I came across a floor-standing sandwich board displaying these words:

"WITH THE CHANGING SEASONS COMES A NEW BEGINNING"



My mind immediately thought of this magazine with my up-coming turn to contribute the letter for March. The sandwich board might have said "Looking forward to Spring" or words along that line. To me the actual words on that board were more encompassing. The statement held a broader, richer meaning. It suggested that there was the opportunity to start again, to be refreshed.

Sometimes it is necessary to make an apology. By its very nature, a genuine apology puts in position the chance for a new beginning. Other examples can be thought of and considered too.

Very soon, Burstow Church is to have its spire re-shingled with hundreds of individual oak shingles. Here is another new beginning. For the next fifty or sixty plus years, the spire will be strong again to point heavenward from a church that began its life on that very site in the twelfth century. It has witnessed countless changing seasons, and if it could talk it would be able to relate stories from bygone centuries of life as it was known through the ages. Many details of events in our history would be revealed.

It is a once in a generation renovation task. We all have the opportunity to witness and participate in the event. Each of us will have the chance to sponsor a shingle, signing it and even including a brief message. That very shingle will be part of the visibly renovated tower. Our church architect, who was with a group of us at a meeting in January, told us of a church he knew that when its old shingles were removed for replacing, names and messages that had long ago been written on them were still legible!

In the natural world change is happening as we gradually move from the darkness and depth of winter into the promise of spring's new beginning. We are aware of the earliest flowers that give us joy – the tough little snowdrops that, no matter what the weather has thrown at them, will raise their white heads to greet us. Crocuses and daffodils present their vibrant colours.

The days are lengthening and later in March we will happily adjust the time one hour forward on our clocks heralding a new beginning of 'summer time'.

Yes, the natural seasons and astronomical seasons in our part of the world bring about changes and we see new beginnings and differences around us.

Words from the garden centre's sandwich board are applicable to us as people too. We have numerous chances within ourselves to maximise new beginnings. Think about it! Each day is unique. It comes but once before very quickly becoming our past. Each change of day presents us with opportunities to seize on a new beginning. As we go about each day's affairs do we make the best of our chances to show greater compassion and consideration to one another in our families, at school, at work and within the community? Could we have spoken in a kindlier way, or exercised greater concern and understanding? Should we have been more helpful and made better use of our time? The possibilities of opportunity to make even the slightest change are there to bring about new beginnings. If each of us would take one aspect of our living and implement even a small change for the good, a big difference would result.


March presents us with Spring leading into April when we look forward and celebrate the joyous festival of Easter.

NATURE WATCH

WINTER TIME

Late lies the wintry sun abed, A frosty, fiery sleepy-head; Blinks but an hour or two and then, A blood red orange sinks again.

his first verse of Robert Louis Stevenson's poem perfectly captures the grey picture of a winter's day with thin sunshine. Although we have had a few sunny periods since the start of the new-year we do seem to have had a lot of grey, cloudy days. Early February gave us two weeks of freezing temperatures, during which we might normally expect blue skies and sunshine, but there was barely a glimpse of the sun; according to the met office we were caught in a high-pressure zone that had become static over Scandinavia. One area in the country reported eleven consecutive days without sun. Then in the last week of the month the wind direction moved to the south and south west giving temperatures of up to 15°C but with more and more rain leaving the ground completely waterlogged. One example of how poor the ground conditions had become was featured in an email to customers by D T Brown the plant and seed merchants, who reported that their trial grounds were like a mud bath and advised customers to keep off their plots until the weather and soil became warmer and drier, and in the meantime, concentrate on growing seeds inside. However, all was not gloom and despondency, the first signs of spring were beginning to show. Between the many showers there were periods of sunshine and things started to warm up. Birds begun to sing, having been silent during the cold period to save energy; flowers suddenly opened up like the primroses and garden escape crocuses on the common at the top end of Millers and I spotted my first daffodils on the verge opposite the old School House.

Buds were also beginning to swell on young hornbeam trees and in the garden, a spring flowering cherry tree was showing the green of young leaves peeping through the scales of the small brown buds. Birds have already started pairing-up and blue and great tits have been busy preparing the garden nest boxes. Generally, squirrels keep to their dreys during the cold months but I spotted one very carefully eating the small and immature, almost embryo nuts, on the twisted hazel – they clearly have a very good memory or calendar.



I have mentioned before that the Cornell University, Laboratory of Ornithology produces a free computer app called Merlin, which can recognise both individual bird song and identify birds from photographs. As the app can be used on mobile phones it is very handy to have when confronted by an unusual bird on a country walk. This specialist university department also runs an annual worldwide bird count, which this year has produced some fascinating results. They received over 232,000 online checklists from over 208 countries and sub regions, saved more than 482,000 Merlin sightings and recorded over 7,700 different bird species. For twitchers and other interested parties, the final report will be published in March.





HAREWOODS HOME FARM - HELLO WALKERS

At last spring is around the corner and we would like to write about work at Harewoods Home Farm. That's us behind The Bell Pub. I'm sure you have all found the footpath extremely difficult to navigate on our heavy clay soil. We have found it very difficult to work in these conditions too. Each Season is presenting us with ever more hurdles to navigate and arable farming is becoming more and more difficult. We have always tried to protect and help wildlife and we are now focusing more on conservation projects.

We have just planted an additional hedgerow along the footpath from the stile at The Bell. This consists of 8 different hedging plants all of which will have something to offer insects, mammals and birds, either in habitat or food. The young plants (whips) are still very small at the moment and we ask for your help to protect them from being trampled on, especially whilst they are establishing.

We will be putting up some notices to explain the plants and their benefits which we hope you will enjoy reading.

As soon as the ground dries out enough to drive the tractors on again we will roll it and try to reinstate a walkable footpath!

At the other end of the farm, further North along Outwood Lane, we are trying to establish a Wild Flower Meadow together with special areas of crops for nesting birds and winter-feeding grounds.

We will keep you posted!

We are delighted to announce that Claire welcomed her son, Rafael Peter Hawksbee, into the world on 17th January. While Claire is on maternity leave we still want to provide residents with an update on what we are working on locally and what has been happening in Parliament each month.

The Chancellor's speech on growth in February contained a commitment to a third runway at Heathrow, but stopped short of giving a firm commitment on potential expansion of Gatwick. The airport is acutely important to the lives and livelihoods of those who rely on Gatwick for their jobs – either directly or indirectly.

We will be pushing for a number of measures including an increase in noise monitors across the constituency to gather accurate, reliable data on how flight paths are affecting residents, better noise mitigation for local residents who will be affected by any construction work and flights, improvements to sewage treatment works, better car parking on-site and better traffic monitoring.

The Government has also decided to cancel this year's local elections. This is being done to pave the way for the abolition of district and county councils, which will be replaced with larger, single-tier 'unitary' local authorities. Councils are currently drafting their proposals for an interim plan, which is due by 21st March, with the Secretary of State Angela Rayner then making a decision after the submission of a full proposal by 9th May. There is no national public consultation, but our local District and Borough Councils will be looking to run consultations between 21st March and 9th May.

In the House of Commons, the Opposition has forced a vote in both Houses on cancelling the elections – something that the Chief Executive of the Electoral Commission has raised concerns about. We are clear that local government restructuring should not be imposed by top-down Whitehall diktat – the Government have been rushing this decision, and there has been a severe lack of effort to gather consensus within two-tier areas across the country.

We believe that more time should be taken to understand how these changes will affect the structure of local government, and to give residents an opportunity to share their views. In East Surrey, representatives of the district and borough councils and Surrey County Council are meeting regularly to discuss the proposal that will be submitted to the Secretary of State by 21st March, and particularly what should happen with the significant debts accrued by Woking Borough Council. We will keep residents updated as developments take place.

It is disappointing that Lloyds Bank has confirmed the closure of their branch in Caterham. Cash Access, who have confirmed they will be opening a Banking Hub in Caterham to maintain services for residents, and in a meeting they confirmed that Lloyds will not be able to close until the Banking Hub is open. An out-of-hours cash point has also been recommended. Finally, as Network Rail and GTR were considering changes to the next rail timetable, we created an East Surrey Rail Survey to offer residents a platform to share their ideas. Over 500 people got in touch to share their views, which, at the time of writing, we are currently processing. We will be meeting with Network Rail and GTR in the next few weeks to go through residents' feedback, with the aim of reviewing and adjusting the timetable to better suit the needs of local residents.
